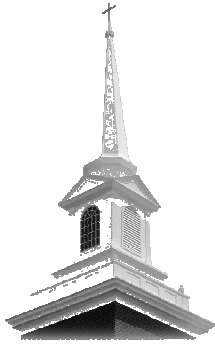


# FRIENDSHIP

In 1997, when we began the design work on our current building, one of the things we wanted to accomplish was to have the new building look like a church. We are not a school, or a concert hall, or a counseling center, or a conference center – we are a church. The steeple, designed to be obvious and to be in full view for the community, is a symbol of the fact that we are a church that directs people to God. Our name, Friendship Christian Reformed Church, also communicates that we are, not only a church, but a friendly church; and that we are part of the Christian Reformed denomination.

While the steeple symbolizes that we are a church (building), our name symbolizes that we are a loving, caring body of believers. We strive to serve in an excellent way so that our actions match our name.

As a church, and as the body of believers at Friendship CRC, we have two goals:

1. To reach the lost for Christ.
2. To develop and maintain the spiritual growth of our church members.

To accomplish these goals, we try to focus on:

- caring for each other (congregational care);
- challenging each other to grow in our spiritual lives (discipleship);
- helping others to know more about Christ (outreach);
- and, celebrating our God in worship (worship & music).

Throughout our short history, FCRC has intentionally involved and included all ages, and in particular our youth, in our congregational care, our discipleship programs, our outreach efforts, and our worship & music. We will continue to do so.

The end result of our two goals and of our focus ministries is that we will all be closer to God; we pray for this continually. We hope that when you see the steeple, with the cross on top of it – raised high – you can be reminded of the need to direct your life to God (steeple) and to believe fully in Jesus as your Savior (cross).
